Median Committee Minutes

May 10, 2018

The Median Committee (Beth, Bobbi, Bob and Jose) met with Brian Morehead, Newark City Engineer, on April 6, 2018. A broad range of topics were addressed, which afforded the continued good relations with the office as well as a good resolution of issues.

1. Lamp Post: The post at 223 Hudson Ave is irregular and is to be swapped out with a regular post - already done.
2. Street Sign: The missing sign at Hudson and St Clair will be addressed when ODOT finishes the remaining construction in that area.
3. Hudson Trees: HHCA can plant trees on Hudson from the service road to St Clair. It would be preferable to plant them behind the sidewalk given the presence of utility lines under the curb.
4. Fencing: The area extending from the service road north on Mt Vernon Rd. will become grass area. New fencing is to be erected along the road.
5. Road Work: (a) Repairs to 3rd St. are ahead of schedule - currently open. (b) The remaining work on Church St is expected to be completed in August.
6. Downtown Project: The downtown project involving the separation of sewer and storm waters will be completed once all the system extending south of downtown to National drive is done.
7. Hudson Median: Brian Morehead believes the median is simple and will not necessitate a formal agreement between HHCA and the City. But he will check with the city officials.
8. Railroad: Ohio Central Railroad has been bought by the Geneseo businesses on the east coast. The city has had good working relations with the company
